

Ask an IRIS Optometrist



Q: I have been told laser eye surgery only corrects your distance vision. Is laser surgery safe and what if you also have a reading prescription?

A: Laser eye surgery is very safe. Actually some experts have stated the long term risk of infection due to contact lens wear far outweighs the risk of having laser eye surgery. This has been enough to convince me to have my own laser eye surgery.

Usually patients under 40 do not have a reading prescription and the vast majority of laser eye surgery procedures for these patients only require distance vision correction. This is because usually patients under 40 still retain the eyes natural focussing ability for near vision. For most patients, near vision starts to become an issue at approximately 40-45 years of age. There is a laser procedure that can correct both the reading prescription (or presbyopia) in addition to correcting the distance vision, effectively making the patient free from spectacle wear. This "Laser Blended Vision" procedure allows patients to see more naturally at distance and near without the use of glasses or contact lenses. The procedure works very well in the 40-55 age group, with older patient's possibly needing correction at near for very detailed tasks. However, for most day to day tasks most patients are completely independent of any form of correction. Keep in mind that if you have laser eye surgery, you still need to see your optometrist at least once every two years (every year if you are over 65, under 19 or have diabetes). Remember, many eye diseases go undetected (such as glaucoma), as they have no symptoms. Your optometrist is very well positioned using state of the art equipment and years of training to detect eye diseases and arrange appropriate care.

Q: I have seen adverts for "free eye tests". Should I be wary of this and am I putting my eye health at risk?

A: Annual eye exams are still covered by the government for people under 19 and over 65. Even if you are between these ages, you can still be covered for your eye examination if a disease process is found by your optometrist or if you are diabetic. "Free" eye tests, more commonly known as "sight testing" does not include any health examination of your eyes and thus you are putting you eye health at significant risk. "Sight testing" is usually done by someone who is not a doctor using a machine. This act is illegal in Ontario and the College of Optometrists of Ontario is currently pursuing legal routes to prosecute those involved and has already been successful in prosecuting certain groups. Examination of the eyes is only allowed by law to be done by a registered optometrist or physician. You should be very wary of anyone willing to put your eye health at risk by offering to "test your eyes free". Your eyesight deserves a thorough health check in addition to an accurate prescription as



determined by a doctor. Your eyes are best served by a health care team – do not settle for anything less. Remember, your eyecare team comprises of (a) the optician, who fills your prescription, (b) the optometrist, who examines the health of your eyes and issues prescriptions and if required (c) the ophthalmologist, who mainly performs any required eye surgery. Many people are often confused as to the roles of the people within the eyecare team.


"Sight testing" does not include any health examination of your eyes and thus you are putting your eye health at significant risk.

The IRIS model of practice with all three health professionals working together as inter-disciplinary collaboration is the best way to provide care to your patient and is in fact encouraged by the Ministry of Health in Ontario.


More ways to save water (and money!) in Guelph

Way to go, Guelph - you're making a difference through water conservation

As one of the largest cities in Canada reliant solely on groundwater for our water supply, it is essential that we use our water wisely in Guelph. Water conservation not only makes sense for the environment, but also for our wallets and our community, too! Whether by planting water efficient gardens, collecting rainwater or greywater, or educating people about how to conserve water, many Guelph residents, businesses and organizations are helping to conserve and protect our water resources.

Less Water, More Rebates

The City of Guelph is constantly coming up with new ways to make saving water fun and easy. In addition to our low-flow toilet (\$75 rebate) and front load washing machine (\$100 rebate) programs, we launched two exciting new rebate programs in 2010. You can now receive up to a \$70 rebate for replacing your old, inefficient furnace mounted home humidifier, which will save water and improve your home's air quality at the same time. If your home was built after 1985, you may also be eligible to receive \$60 for replacing a water-primed floor drain trap primer with a waterless model. Does your house qualify?
