#### More ways to save water (and money!) in Guelph

#### Way to go, Guelph - you're making a difference through water conservation

As one of the largest cities in Canada reliant solely on groundwater for our water supply, it is essential that we use our water wisely in Guelph. Water conservation not only makes sense for the environment, but also for our wallets and our community, too! Whether by planting water efficient gardens, collecting rainwater or greywater, or educating people about how to conserve water, many Guelph residents, businesses and organizations are helping to conserve and protect our water resources.

#### Less Water, More Rebates

The City of Guelph is constantly coming up with new ways to make saving water fun and easy. In addition to our low-flow toilet (\$75 rebate) and front load washing machine (\$100 rebate) programs, we launched two exciting new rebate programs in 2010. You can now receive up to a \$70 rebate for replacing your old, inefficient furnace mounted home humidifier, which will save water and improve your home's air quality at the same time. If your home was built after 1985, you may also be eligible to receive \$60 for replacing a water-primed floor drain trap primer with a waterless model. Does your house qualify? Visit guelph.ca/rebates to learn more.

# Understanding Binocular Vision

Reading can be a lot harder when you're seeing two of every word. One in ten children has this problem. Together we can help.

BV problems are difficult for a child to explain and often go undetected even to an observant caregiver.

Imagine sitting down with a warm glass of tea ready to read your favorite novel but today something isn't working quite right. As you try to read and focus your eyes, they don't respond correctly, in fact, every twenty seconds or so the words slide into each other causing you to lose your place. As

you continue reading, the words gradually begin to dance from side to side becoming tangled with each other leaving you with a sense of fatigue and frustration. You consciously force your eyes to hold still trying to remember what you were reading and why, only to be left confused and exhausted both visually and mentally.

Many children have come to accept this difficulty as normal when they try to read and are unable to give voice to their problem. Reading ability is affected in BV dysfunction and sadly, this vision issue may have gone undetected for years.

#### 1 in 10 children has a binocular vision issue that is affecting their life. This number is possibly as common as up to 6 in 10 in learning disabled groups.

Children are creative, adaptive and resilient. Many visual difficulties go undetected as children seek to learn in other ways. Children compensate by touching, by holding, by getting closer to what they are looking at or moving around to find a place where they can be comfortable. We often consider these children "inattentive" or "hyperactive". In fact, binocular vision issues are three times more common in those deemed as having ADHD and 5 out of the 9 clinical criteria used for ADHD diagnosis are identical in binocular vision dysfunction. It has been recommended that BV issues be ruled out first in suspected ADHD children. In reality, many of these children may simply have an untreated eye muscle issue that is relatively easy to manage and correct.

Unfortunately, current statistics show that only 50% of children have even had a basic eye examination before completing high school. Often a more detailed work-up in addition to a basic eye examination is required to diagnose and treat many binocular vision issues. Vision Therapy has been proven effective for treating BV dysfunction. Left untreated, children with eye coordination issues often lose interest in their studies.

Even children who excel at their current grade level may have subtle underlying issues that they are coping with. These children have often figured out how to manage their problem and can go through life never realizing they are not seeing as they should.

#### Top 5 symptoms of BV dysfunction:

- 1. Frontal headaches (forehead and/or around the eyes).
- Losing your place whilst reading or having to use your finger/ruler to track
- Seeing text drifting in and out of focus when reading or writing.
- Easily distracted from reading/near point activities.
- Rubbing eyes when reading & general agitation/resistance to reading.
