**Question:** I have both a distance and a near prescription. Can I wear contacts or have laser eye surgery?

**Answer:** Absolutely. There are many more vision correction options available today that were not available 5-10 years ago. For example, better contact lens designs are available for patients with both distance and near prescriptions that are more comfortable and have better optics than contact lens designs of the past. Previous methods such as "monovision correction" (basically one eye corrected for near and one eye corrected for distance) are becoming less common and multifocal contact lenses, which allow for more natural vision, are become a more popular option with both doctors and patients. Laser eye surgery is also following suit, with a presbyopia procedure now being also available for patients who have both a distance and near prescription (and are showing no signs of cataracts). Not everyone is a candidate for laser eye surgery but your optometrist will advise you if
