

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# CAN ULTRAVIOLET RADIATION AFFECT YOUR EYES?

Sunglasses aren't just fashion accessories anymore; they are necessary protection for your eyes. Everyone is at risk of eye damage from the sun. Prolonged exposure to the sun's UV rays and short wavelength light can contribute to a number of ocular complications. These can include: photokeratitis or 'snow blindness' (painful inflammation of the cornea); pingueculae and pterygia (abnormal growths on the surface of the eye); cataracts; macular degeneration and even cancer.

New research suggests that the sun's high energy visible — **HEV** radiation, also called 'blue light,' may increase long term risk of macular degeneration because it can penetrate deep into the eye reaching the retina (nerve rich lining of the eye that is used for seeing). Sunglasses should block 100 % of UV rays and also absorb most HEV rays.

Tinted glasses without UV protection, cause more harm than wearing no glasses at all, because your pupils dilate to allow more light to enter the eye thus allowing in more radiation. Sunglasses should not be dark enough that they distort colors and recognition of traffic signals.

Ultraviolet (UV) rays are higher in energy and do not fall within the realm of visible light, as shown here. In the electromagnetic spectrum, radio waves have the lowest energy, and gamma rays have the highest energy.

ANYONE WHO SPENDS TIME OUTDOORS IS AT RISK FOR EYE PROBLEMS FROM UV RADIATION. RISKS OF EYE DAMAGE FROM UV AND HEV EXPOSURE CHANGE FROM DAY TO DAY AND DEPEND ON A NUMBER OF FACTORS, INCLUDING: GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION, ALTITUDE, TIME OF DAY, SETTING, MEDICATIONS.



## KIDS NEED UV PROTECTION EVEN MORE THAN ADULTS

The risk of damage to our eyes and skin from solar UV radiation is cumulative, meaning the danger continues to grow as we spend time in the sun throughout our lifetime. With this in mind, it is especially important for kids to protect their eyes from the sun. They should not be toy sunglasses but real sunglasses that indicate the UV p rotection. Polycarbonate lenses are generally recommended for children as they are the most shatter resistant. Children and teenagers generally spend much more time outdoors than adults. In fact, experts say as much as 80 percent of our lifetime exposure to UV rays occurs by age 18. Therefore, make sure your kids' eyes are protected from the sun with good quality sunglasses. Also, encourage your child to wear a hat on sunny days to further reduce UV exposure.

#### TIPS FOR PURCHASING SUNGLASSES

- Close fitting, larger or wrap around frames
- Darker lenses does not mean more protection
- Check the UV protection and HEV absorption
